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Washrooms/Laundry Rooms: New toilets and washers and dryers have been installed in both upper and lower washrooms and laundry rooms. The new rate per load is \$3.00 for the dryers and \$2.00 for the washers.

Improvements to Sites: All improvements made to any designated campsite and the maintenance of them are the responsibility of the License Holder and must be in compliance with the Rules and Regulations of SLSCA.

Please contact the Park Manager prior to commencing any work on your site such as tree removal, building of new fence, building a shed, altering existing structures, or altering existing sewer, electric or water.

Selling a License to Occupy: Share transfers will not be approved by Spider Lake Springs Holdings Inc. until the lot associated with the share is in complete compliance with current regulations.

Social Events: Victoria Day long weekend events will be posted to the SLSR website and Facebook pages.

AGM: The 2023 AGM will be held Sunday, May 21st at 10:00am in the park at the longhouse.

Property/Liability Insurance: It is the responsibility of owners to have adequate insurance for their property and site.

Dogs: Campers are responsible to clean up after them. All dogs must be kept on a leash when outside of a campsite and secured within a campsite. This is for the safety of all the beloved pets in the park. There are 2 dog parks, where your pet can be off leash but must be supervised by the owner.

Tarps: All tarps, temporary covers, and covers of any kind placed over the roofs of Recreational Vehicles, Sleeping Units, or other structures, shall be totally removed and neatly stored in/on the designated campsite by the end of the long weekend in May.

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Emergency Contact: There is an emergency contact card on the SLSR website under the Documents tab that includes the emergency phone number, which is 250-240-7818. How do emergency staff gain access to the park? Bowser Fire Station has a gate card in all their trucks. As ambulance services come from a number of areas it is not feasible to give them all gate passes. All emergency staff use the buzzer at the gate and will be escorted by park staff to the emergency.

Water Supply: We have 2 wells that supply the water for the resort. This water supply is tested daily as per Island Heath regulations.

As the system is managed by electric pumps, in the event there is a power outage there is no water to the park. When this happens, washrooms and laundry are locked down until power is restored.

We would like to remind shareholders, our peak season is May, June, July and August. Our water is under high demand during these months. This prohibits the use of sprinkling systems during the day. Programmed sprinkling systems should be run between 8pm and 5am for no longer than 1 hour. We strongly recommend hand watering and to do so early morning or evenings. If we all work together on conserving water, we are hopeful that water shortage will be non-existent this camping season.

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
